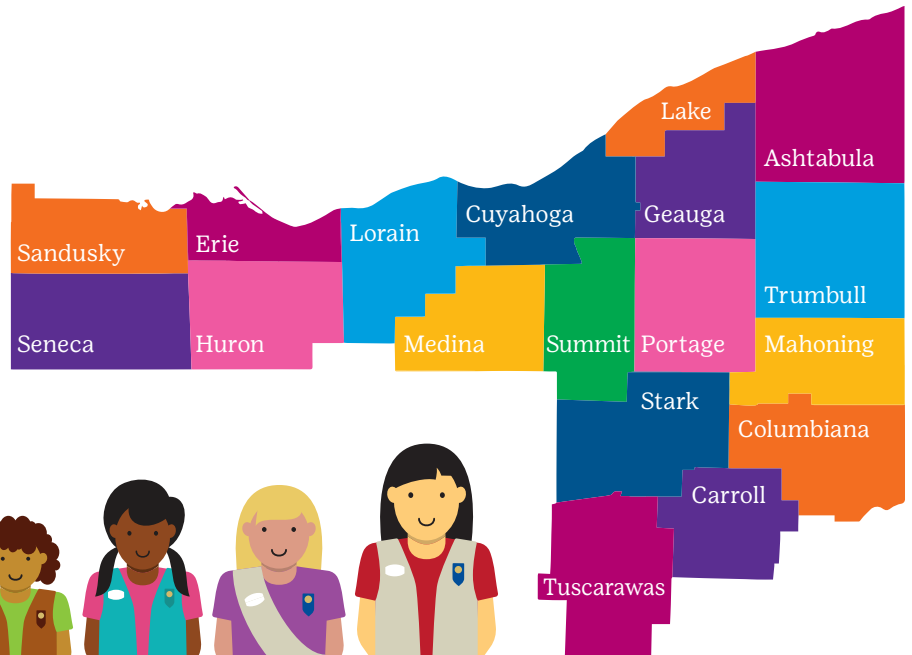

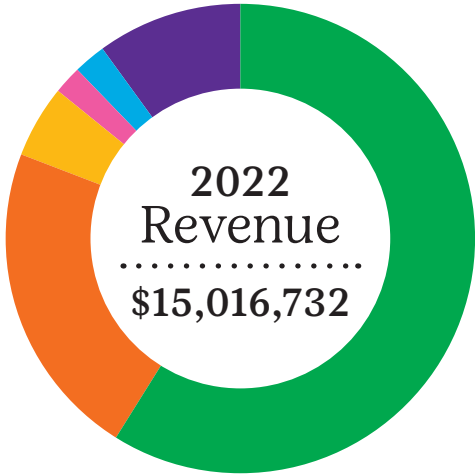

The Journey Program

Thanks to the Akron Community Foundation, The Mary S. and David C. Corbin Foundation, and the Sisler McFawn Foundation, Girl Scouting is accessible to girls in Akron City Schools who could not otherwise participate. For several years, through their generous support, Girl Scouts of North East Ohio has been offering the Journey Program in Akron Schools.

The Journey Program is designed to ensure the fundamental Girls Scout Leadership Experience—regularly found in Girls Scout troops—is available to all girls. The Journey Program, however, is facilitated by Girls Scout staff members and based at local schools. Journeys are part of the nationally developed Girl Scout curriculum and are deeper dives into the four program pillars: STEM, life skills, entrepreneurship, and the outdoors. The Girl Scout Journey Program is built around a tailored selection of Journeys. Girls work on the activities together and complete hands-on activities, spurring discussion to get girls thinking critically. Typically meeting after school one day a week, girls work together to earn badges, sell cookies, and do community service projects.

The Akron Community Foundation, The Mary S. and David C. Corbin Foundation, and the Sisler McFawn Foundation have also supported the Girl Scouts of North East Ohio's STEM Center of Excellence capital campaign.

Bridging Generations at Camp Timberlane

There are some individuals that are so passionate about Girl Scouts that – if it were possible – many agree that they would bleed green. One such “green blood” was Mary Lou Fullgrabe: girl member, volunteer extraordinaire, staff member, and even Executive Director of GSNEO's Legacy Councils.

Camp Timberlane held a special place in Mary Lou’s heart, and so her family built a bridge at the camp in her honor. The bridge stood for many years until it washed away in the 2020-21 winter storms. When told of this, Mary Lou’s son (and former GSNEO Board Chair) Dan Bragg immediately stepped up to fund the bridge replacement through personal donations and matching funds from his company. Thanks to Dan’s support and Mary Lou’s legacy, Fullgrabe Bridge will support many more generations of Girl Scouts at Camp Timberlane.



GSNEO is fortunate to have another pair of passionate “green bloods” with a soft spot for Camp Timberlane. Long-time volunteers Bob and Fran Fisher have been integral parts of two different trail bridge projects over the past three decades— one built in 1991 and the other built in 1995.

In 2022, the Fisher’s were hiking at Camp Timberlane, reminiscing, and saw the original bridge from 1991. After speaking with Camp Manager Ed Lampe, who confirmed their suspicion that the bridge needed to be replaced, the Fisher's jumped into action. Through personal donations and a matching retiree gift policy from Bob Fisher’s former company, Fisher’s Crossing has undergone a complete rebuild!

The next time you visit Camp Timberlane, take a moment to walk across its bridges and appreciate the many hands, hearts, and histories that worked to make these pathways possible.

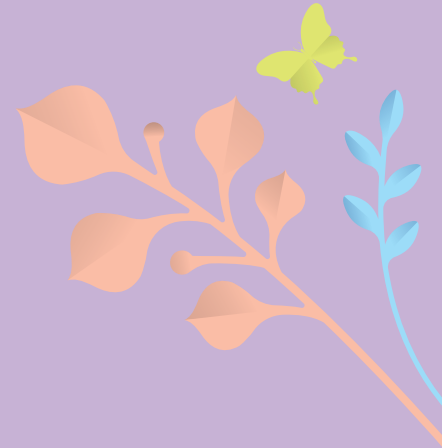
